Friday 15 August was the 80th anniversary of **VJ Day** and the Rayne Commemoration Group erected a display of soldier silhouettes representing those members of the Allied Forces who died during this the 'Forgotten Campaign' of the Second World War. Although VE day on May 8 is often felt to be the end of WW2 it actually ended on the capitulation of Japan some 3 months later.

Edward Law Staines, from Rayne, died in this campaign 1 March 1945 in Burma.

A message from Rev Rachel.

August 2025

Dear Friends

"Truly, we live with mysteries too marvellous to be understood... Let me keep my distance, always, from those who think they have the answers. Let me keep company always with those who say "Look!" and laugh in astonishment, and bow their heads." (Mary Oliver, "Mysteries Yes)

Sometimes people think that faith is about certainty, about having a very fixed view of the world and answers to all the big questions of life. In the Bible, the book of Job centres on the question, "why does God allow suffering?" In the book Job's friends "comfort" him with their easy answers to his problems...but at the end, when the voice of God finally speaks, God says that they have not spoken the truth. We must beware of easy answers. The Bible contains many voices, and for those of us who are disciples of Jesus, we learn to read the Bible through "his lens", interpreting Scripture through his life and love.

Mary Oliver reminds us that there is so much of life that is mysterious. In Church, when we share Holy Communion – the meal of bread and wine Jesus gave us to remember him and in which he is present – we say "Great is the mystery of faith"; we share in the mystery together.

This September, we will run another Alpha Course. Alpha is a warm and welcoming space for anyone curious about the Christian faith. It's not about preaching nor prescribing answers, it's about exploring together big questions such as "is there more to life than this?" and "who is Jesus?"

Each session we watch a video, eat some delicious dessert and discuss our reflections. One of the most wonderful parts of an Alpha group are the friendships that are formed. People come to Alpha not because they have all the answers, but because they are curious, and as they keep company together over eight weeks, there are often lots of moments of laughter as well as quiet awe.

Mary Oliver's poem reminds us that the sacred is not always found in certainty, but in surprise—in the simple act of someone saying "Look!" and laughing in astonishment. Faith, too, often grows not with answers but with wonder.

Our heartfelt thanks go to Ken and Matt as they take a back seat knowing that the allotments will continue under a new group of volunteers who are determined to keep it going.

FELSTED AID FOR DEPRIVED CHILDREN

There is to be a further delivery to Ukraine in October of this year. The following items have been requested, the most urgent of which being the food items:

- Tinned fish
- Pasta
- Porridge oats
- Tinned fruit
- Lentils (NOT baked beans!)



Also,

- Children's clothes and shoes (*not trainers*)— new or nearly new
- Disposable nappies
- Toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, shower gel, toilet rolls
- Washing powder
- Female sanitary products
- Stoma bags
- Bedding (*no blankets or duvets please*)
- Children's toys & games
- Wheelchairs and walking aids

Medical items e.g. syringes and needles, bandages, cotton wool (*no medications e.g. medicines, tablets etc*)

The collection point will be open until 14th September 2025 and is to be located at 5 Brunwin Road, Rayne. Please leave items beside the garage which is to the left of the property, and protected from the weather if at all possible!

You might be interested to know that the couple who run the charity, which is called Felsted Aid for Deprived Children, have both been awarded an MBE for charity and humanitarian aid work in Ukraine.

The charity would also be very grateful for contributions towards food as they are able to purchase a pallet of food for £450. DISTRICT COUNCILLOR – ANN HOOKS

Hello to all. I hope this report finds you well.

Surprisingly, despite the two-month gap between editions of *Rayne in Focus*, there isn't a huge amount to update residents on. This is partly due to my own family holiday, and partly because local government tends to quieten down over the summer months.



That said, I do have an important update regarding the status of the Local Plan Review. Residents will recall that several parcels of land in Rayne were submitted through the Call for Sites exercise. Officers recommended two of these for inclusion. One of the proposed sites included land to the west of Rayne—specifically, land north of The Street and behind the school, along with two further parcels adjacent to the Flitch Way on the south side of The Street. I attended the meeting where the Rayne sites were discussed, to observe the debate. Rayne Parish Council, along with a heartfelt contribution from a resident, spoke against the West of Rayne proposal.

The committee ultimately agreed that this proposed allocation was simply too large and that the Flitch Way should be protected. They acknowledged the significant time and investment previously made by Braintree District Council in defending this important linear country park between Braintree and Rayne. The committee felt that the rural setting beyond Rayne deserved the same level of protection.

Although the site was presented as a “landscape-led” development, the committee raised concerns that such policies may lack the strength and clarity needed to prevent long-term harm. Excluding this site was therefore seen as a way to offer greater resilience and protection for Rayne from inappropriate development.

Meanwhile, the employment allocation at Tamdown Way was approved. However, this came with an informative requiring the protection of the hedgerow and assurance that development would not negatively affect operations at the airfield.

The meetings to discuss the smaller sites have now concluded. We now await the three major meetings in September and October, which will address the strategic-scale sites. With 8,000 homes still to be allocated, concerns remain about where these developments will go—particularly given that the Government has now confirmed it will not widen the A12.

This raises renewed questions around the potential use of the West of Braintree land—between Rayne, Blake End, and Saling—for large-scale development. We'll have to wait until nearer the time to see what proposals are brought forward. However, it's worth remembering that this land was previously rejected by a Government Inspector during the last Local Plan submission. That may still count against its viability.

More to follow as we learn more.

PLANNING

25/01333/TPO – 15 Warner Close, Rayne

Notice of intent to carry out works to trees protected by Tree Preservation Order TPO 15/01:

Field Maple T24 – Crown reduction. Reduce to height 7 metres, width 5 metres

Tree Warden comments:

This tree is on the boundary of two gardens. It's on the way to becoming fully grown and is now a very significant size. Species such as this are commonly used to plant in medium sized gardens as they are native and can be managed by cyclical pruning. A crown reduction down to 7m height and 5m wide would be good management and ultimately prolong the lifespan of this tree.

25/01382/TPO – Tudor Cottage, 2 Shalford Road, Rayne

Notice of intent to carry out works to trees protected by Tree Preservation Order TPO 3/2023:

T1 – 1No. Walnut tree – reduce size up to 3 metres all around

Tree Warden comments:

Unfortunately, this tree was planted too close to the house when considering its ultimate size at maturity. The result is the crown now engulfing the rear of the property. It would seem quite reasonable to want it reduced back significantly. However, walnuts do not like severe crown reduction and care will need to be exercised when achieving the desired effect. Furthermore, when cut at the wrong time of year they can suffer severe bleeding (sap) which will be detrimental. My opinion is that reductions should only occur in July/August/September.

25/01606/FUL - Fentons Farm , Fentons Road, Rayne

Conversion of barns into 1 No. dwellinghouse, with single-storey extension and single-storey link extension.

No planning objection to this application

25/01493/FUL – Goulds Farm, Shalford Road, Rayne

Construction of steel framed agricultural building to store machinery and grain.
